Professor Markku Sotarauta

Professor Sotarauta is dean of the School of Management and professor of policy making theories and practices (local and regional development) at the University of Tampere, Finland. In 2008 he was appointed as a Visiting Professor in the Newcastle University Business School (UK) for a three year period. He specialises in leadership, innovation systems, and institutional entrepreneurship in local and regional development. He has worked with the Finnish Parliament, many Finnish ministries, OECD as well as cities and regions both in Finland and beyond.

Professor of Regional Economic Development and Policy at University of Strathclyde, Visiting or Adjunct Professor at Anglia Ruskin University, Curtin University, University of Tampere, and Newcastle University.
